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Prayer

Prayer is for the purpose of experiencing God's transformational work in our lives . . . and nothing more. Righteousness in all it's dimensions flow out of this connection. Prayer is coming into the secret place with God and working through the thoughts in our hearts with Him. He alone need be aware of our inmost desires and struggles . . . and the outcome will be publicly noticed. "In the secret place of prayer, where no eye but God's can see, no ear but His can hear, we may pour out our most hidden desires and longings to the Father of infinite pity, and in the hush and silence of the soul that voice which never fails to answer the cry of human need will speak to our hearts." Thoughts from the Mount of Blessing, 84.

Fasting

Fasting is, as prayer, focused on an end-point, not an end-point in itself...it is, then, for the purpose of effective service, i.e. Christ-likeness. The point is not the activity—but the impact on one's relationship with God. Should we fast? ABSOLUTELY, but the purpose of the fast MUST NOT be the fast, but a deepening of our relationship with God. PERIOD. Fasting for fasting's sake is a dead-end road. "The object of the fast which God calls upon us to keep is not to afflict the body for the sin of the soul, but to aid us in perceiving the grievous character of sin, in humbling the heart before God and receiving His pardoning grace. His command to Israel was, "Rend your heart, and not your garments, and turn unto the Lord your God." Joel 2:13. "It will avail nothing for us to do penance or to flatter ourselves that by our own works we shall merit or purchase an inheritance among the saints. When the question was asked Christ, "What shall we do, that we might work the works of God?" He answered, "This is the work of God, that ye believe on Him whom He hath sent." John 6:28, 29. Repentance is turning from self to Christ; and when we receive Christ so that through faith He can live His life in us, good works will be manifest." Thoughts from the Mount of Blessing, 87.
